ASIA PACIFIC



An enormous heartfelt thank you to all the Lymphoma Coalition Asia Pacific (LCAP) members taking part in WLAD activities. There have been several new therapy approvals across the region. Japan recently approved brentuximab vendotin in combination of AVD for frontline treatment of Hodgkin lymphoma. Venetoclax has been approved for CLL in Australia. Obinutuzumab, Gazyva, has now been approved in both Japan and Australia for follicular lymphoma and chronic lymphocytic leukaemia (CLL). China's regulatory agency recently accepted a new drug application for tislelizumab, an investigational immune checkpoint inhibitor, for the potential treatment of patients with classical Hodgkin lymphoma who failed to respond or whose disease returned after prior therapies. Acceptance of the new drug application by the National Medical Products Administration of China (NMPA) was based on clinical and non-clinical information, including the results of a pivotal Phase 2 clinical trial. It is always great to see access increase in the region

NEWS FROM EUROPE

Towards Improving the availability of medicines in the EU



Regulatory authorities in the European Union (EU) have set up a task force to improve the availability of medicines by mitigating potential shortages based on a two-year roadmap. The European Medicines Agency (EMA) and the Heads of Medicines Agencies (HMA) organized the task force to achieve five main objectives. These include:

1. facilitating the approval and marketing of medicines in the EU;
2. developing strategies to improve prevention and management of shortages caused by supply chain disruptions;
3. promoting best practices for shortage prevention;
4. improving information-sharing among regulatory authorities;
5. foster collaboration with stakeholders and improve communication of supply issues to citizens.
