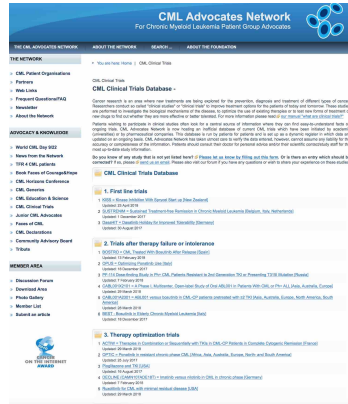
## CML Clinical Trials registry now totals 51 studies

The CML Advocates Network unofficial registry on clinical trials currently lists 51 studies: 28 CML studies currently recruiting patients, 1 non-CML study also in recruiting phase and 22 no longer recruiting studies.

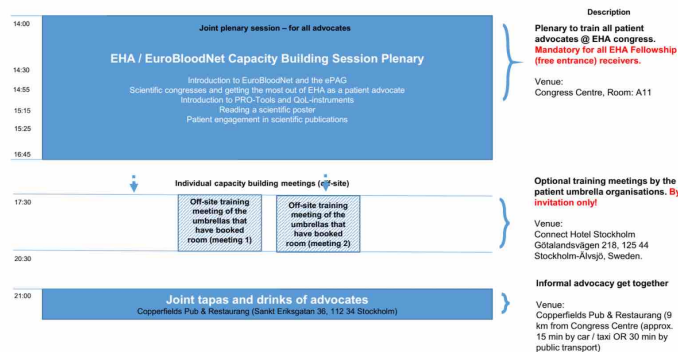
We have recently updated new 11 clinical trials, please visit the complete CML Clinical Trials Registry to check the global research on CML.

## EHA CONGRESS 2018 – Patient Advocacy Programme

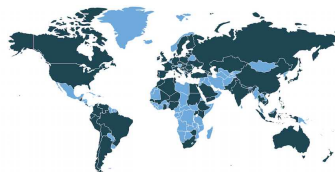
